Treatment Foster Care:

Overcoming trauma to find potential and purpose.

We train loving families to achieve Treatment Foster Care Certification. We then place foster children/youth, newborns through aged 21, with a certified family and provide ongoing support to ensure a holistic healing and treatment environment. Like too many foster kids, our kids have been diagnosed with emotional needs resulting from abuse, neglect and/or other trauma. PLC offers family-focused treatment designed to strengthen and heal with a goal of reuniting children and families or finding another permanent placement.

Family Preservation:

Strengthening families for long-term success.

Child safety is priority number one as families in crisis enter PLC's intensive 6-8 week program designed to mitigate the risk of out-of-home child placement. With therapeutic supports for children and parents, we reduce and remove risk, and stabilize and strengthen the family while fostering relationship with the natural supports the community has to offer.



Kinship Care:

Preserving family connections.

Relatives, such as grandparents, aunts and uncles, are the preferred caregiver when a biological parents are unable to care for the child. With training, community connection, weekly visits, and emotional and mental health support, PLC empowers families to achieve balance and wellness.



Semi-Independent Living:

Confidence, skills, wellness, and success.

For youth transitioning out of foster care, PLC brings together the people, opportunities and training to help ensure short- and long-term success. We provide daily visits, counseling, community connections, and vocational and recreational support, empowering youth to champion their future.



African American Domestic Violence Bystander Prevention Workshops for Faith Leaders and Congregations, Service Providers and the Greater Community

PLC works in the community to provide culturally specific domestic violence awareness training. Through our faith-based initiative, PLC reaches the heart of the community by supporting faith leaders to expand their knowledge and understanding and identification of domestic violence. Faith leaders are provided referral tools to guide and support congregants in crisis. Similarly, our bystander initiative offers education and prevention strategies, and increases awareness of local resources to address domestic violence and sexual assault and by educating providers, we help ensure best practices throughout the region.

PLC is transforming the lives of at-risk children, youth and families. With a focus on child welfare, juvenile adjudication and behavioral health, PLC provides direct support while also connecting people to their communities to ensure long-term success.
