## PLC DC Flexes its Administrative Muscle for Safer Streets

In our Nation's Capital, through a relationship that began in 2009, PLC serves as the administrative partner for DC's Department of Youth Rehabilitative Services (DYRS). In this role, PLC coordinates a continuum of nearly fifteen community-based service providers offering a range of services to court-involved youth and their families. Our "care coordination pathway" streamlines each youth's treatment, engaging caregivers and natural supports such as mentors, and delivering a variety of pro-social out-of-school-time activities. PLC ensures that each youth and their family achieve personal goals and milestones through participation in a wide range of programs that emphasize individual strengths and accountability, skill development, family involvement and community support. Youth favorites include barbering, music production, and computer/technology skill development.



#### New in 2022

Building Blocks DC, an initiative of the mayor, focuses on the small number of individuals responsible for a significant percentage of the city's gun violence. The Building Blocks DC initiative is a collaboration with DYRS, the Office of Gun Violence Prevention (OGVP) and PLC which serves as a grant administrator. As such, for the winter grant competition, PLC received nearly 100 grant applications. We identified 20 providers and have overseen their innovative programming toward the reduction of gun violence. This competition was the first of three that are happening this year. The second competition is currently in the review process and will identify another 20 grant recipients. The final competition will begin in June to identify 35 providers for summer programming. Providers include a mix of small organizations and individuals offering creative engagement projects. These include community days, training in de-escalation tactics, providing counseling to those who have been directly impacted by gun violence, and delivering workforce readiness skill building to youth and young adults.

With our Building Blocks DC success, PLC was selected as grant administrator for Safer, Stronger DC, a citywide public safety effort of the Office of Neighborhood Safety and Engagement (ONSE). The effort addresses violence while also supporting families dealing with the grief and trauma caused by violence. For Safer, Stronger DC, PLC accepted applications from providers of violence interruption services and supports, and case management services. Applications are currently under review, and when this good work begins, we look forward to sharing more.

# For many poor kids, summer vacation is no vacation. More than their more affluent peers, children without financial resources lack access to books, technology, nutrition, exercise, and other enrichment activities. Poor children are more likely to experience loss of learning, and with less access to nutritious food, they are more likely to gain unwanted weight. Caregivers struggle to afford expensive childcare, so poor children often do not receive the oversight they deserve.
