Dear Friends.

In full transparency, I must admit that I dropped my laptop. It was in a padded bag, so theoretically it should have been safe. The screen should not have cracked. But when fragile things are not treated with care, they can and often do break. I spent several weeks punishing myself by trying to use what was not usable, until a very insightful conversation revealed the fallacy in my logic. To work again, what is broken must be repaired, restored. Every day we navigate broken situations, broken relationships, broken trust. At Progressive Life Center, our mission is to help families improve relationships, restore trust, and carve a path forward to healing and wholeness.

In Prince George's County, Maryland, our Kinship Care Program supports family members who have stepped up to repair what has become broken. These "kinship caregivers" are family members who seek to restore a sense of normalcy by raising their relative's child when the parent is unable, or unwilling. For these caregivers – often grandmothers – the support we offer in helping to navigate school, extracurriculars, childcare and healthcare, is a lifeline. Staff's emotional support and counseling provides comfort and direction. Every day, and through our many programs, PLC makes it possible for restoration to take place, for brokenness to be repaired.

PLC Maryland: Stellar Domestic Violence Education

PLC's own Lisa Streeter was recently recognized by the Prince George's County's Office of the Sheriff for her work as a "critical force against Domestic Violence - providing awareness and resources for victims, and supporting important partnerships between communities, providers and law enforcement." In recognition of her efforts and dedication, Lisa received an award at the September 29th Purple Light Nights Lighting Ceremony. The annual event, presented by the Sheriff's Office, serves to emphasize the importance of stopping the cycles of domestic violence in families and inspire survivors to share their experiences to bring awareness and help other victims.

Over the past several years, with oversight from Maryland Regional Director Evette Clarke, Lisa has built a far reaching and impactful domestic violence education initiative serving communities in Prince George's County, Maryland. The initiative began with in-person and then virtual Bystander Education

Workshops presented to faith communities, faith leaders, service providers, and a range of community organizations. Coordinated by Lisa, and led by Arleen B. Joell, President/CEO and Founder of Community Advocates for Family & Youth (CAFY), these culturally relevant trainings teach individuals to identify signs of abuse and to then provide support to a victim of domestic violence and/or sexual assault. The workshops provide information about resources available to support those experiencing abuse, and offer education and prevention strategies specific to the African American community.

Often referred to as the Shadow Pandemic, violence against women was reported to have increased significantly, corresponding with the isolation stemming from pandemic shutdowns. During this time, Lisa supported program expansion to include Sistahs With Voices, a virtual support circle for survivors of domestic and dating violence, sexual abuse and stalking. During six weekly virtual gatherings, women share their experiences, recognize healing as a natural process, begin to develop habits to support a healthy body, mind and spirt, and learn about safety planning and financial preparation.

Congratulations, Lisa! And thank you for all that you do for women and families.

For the DC's Office of Gun Violence Prevention, PLC distributed and managed an array of mini-grants to individuals and grass roots organizations focused on making neighborhoods safer while promoting productive and self-sustaining neighborhoods. Funded programming included the DC Youth Theatre Ensemble, Breathe for Change, and Art at Eden.
